ASSIGNMENT

- 1. Assigned Target: INGOLSTADT, GERMANY (Ordnance Depot)
- 2. Commitments: The 401st Group furnished the complete 36 A/C 94th "A" Group. Two PFF A/C were included in the lead squadron, one in each of the other two. A spare accompanied the lead and high squadrons.

3. Route Over England:

a. Takeoff:

Three A/C failed to take off- one had a flat tire which also prevented following ship from taking off - another had supercharger trouble.

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3. b. Squadron and Group Assemblies over Continent:

Takeoff was first set up 20 minutes for change to plan B. Then when lead ship got into takeoff position all times were set back 30 minutes. Ships taxied and took off in darkness and immediately hit rain and snow clouds which extended up to about 10,000'. Finally broke out into scattered clouds over France and later found assembly area clear. After raising assembly altitude 1000' above briefed, to 12,000', there was no difficulty in getting formation together. Departed assembly point on course on time with 12 ships in low squadron, 11 ships in lead squadron and 10 ships in high squadron.

4. Attack:

a. Flight to Target:

On route to Division assembly line a shelf of cloud temporarily broke up the low squadron. However, they reformed again quickly. Division assembly line was hit on time placing our group in proper #3 position in the column. Three returning spares from preceding groups filled our group up to 36 A/C. 94th "B" and 94th "C" were late and far behind in the column. Clouds eventually forced the group 3000' above briefed altitude to 18,000'. Fighters made one attack on the way in, damaging one ship and forcing it to return alone. Buckeye Red finally reported the target weather and recommended attacking at 1000' below briefed, or 14,000'. As the IP was approached the entire area was strictly visual.

b. Bombing Run:

Twenty minutes before the IP the air commander called for visual bombing, by squadrons, in trail. The IP was picked up visually and the turn was made on it exactly as briefed. Preset data was used and the target was picked up by use of extended vision. The drift was killed and then the rate was killed about five minutes before "bombs away", on a barn in line with the target. When it came time to place the crosshairs on the MPI the area was completely smoked over by preceding groups. The cross hairs were finally placed right on the smoke where the briefed target was thought to be. Bombs were salvoed at 1131 with the rest of squadron using a 250' intervalometer setting. H⁺ts were observed just short of the briefed aiming point, with course good. The run was made on AFCE, which functioned okay.

The high and low squadrons made individual runs and also had to synchronize on points outside of the target area because it was so smoked up, and then move the cross hairs to where the MPI was believed to be. None of the 3 lead bombardiers saw the assigned MPI before bombs away. The low squadrons bombs fell short of the assigned MPI but hit in the target area, in the smoke of the previous bombing. The high squadrons bombs hit just a little right but covered the assigned MPI.

4. c. Flight from Target:

Following bombs away the squadrons rallied quickly with 94th "B" and "C" also catching up. As the group approached the shelf of clouds we again climbed back to 17,000'. Then Buckeye recommended letting down to the deck. In letting down thru the layer of clouds the group leader lost several of his ships. Finally we got down to 1000' to pass under a front. Remaining ships stuck together- despite sever turbulence, rain and clouds.

d. Return to Base:

Over the channel and the U.K. the weather improved. All but one air craft returned to base for a normal landing. A/C 44-6113 experienced such severe fighter attack damage that the pilot informed the air commander he was abandoning the aircraft. One crew member has been reported killed, the remaining members are safe or presumed so.

e. Weather:

The weather was 9/10ths undercast until near Paris area but did not affect group formation. After 0600E the undercast became 10/10s with tops 10,000-12,000' to 1000E, at about 4850-1230E it became CAWU. On way back from target a frontal penetration was made at about 0600E, some A/C went down to 1,000'. Gradually cleaned up on way back to base.

f. Fighter Support:

Fighter support was good.

g. Comments on Formation and Interval:

Excellent on bomb run. A good job was done by all pilots in staying together so well as they did while penetrating the front.

h. Conclusions and Recommendations:

None.

5. Aircraft Not Attacking:

A/C 44-6113 - Credit. Attacked by 3-4 E/A before IP. Severly damaged and A/C turned back. Apparantly jettisoned its bombs before finally being abandoned in air. (Other)

A/C 42-97664- No Credit. Failed to reach formation and assembly over
A/C 44-6132 continent. (Personnel)

6. Enemy Opposition:

1049 to 1055 hours in vicinity of 4915-1200E two ME 262 A/C attacked singly. They approached from 6 o'clock about level with low squadron making a slightly climbing attack high squadron which was behind the low and to the right. The first pass carried thugh between high and low box and broke to the right. Lead and high flight of high squadron was damaged and later had to be abandoned over France. Ball turret, tail gunner and top turret of low squad. got in 25 to 40 rounds per gun before enemy A/C got between formation.

MISSION SUMMARY REPORT (Cont)

6. Then wait gunners got a short burst as A/C broke off attack. Second attack was stopped by P-51's who are believed to have destroyed the A/C. Our position in Division column was third, our altitude 13,500'. E/Ac markings were dark top and silver belly with conventional black crosses. 20 or 30 MM. shells noted with black burst and red center. Also at approximately 1102 hours at 4850-1230E, 3 - 4 ME 262's attacked our high squadron. This was just before IP. The E/A came out of the shelf of cloud just above the high squadron after our escort had pulled ahead. First went below this squadron with out power on, pulled up to a level position and passed between lead and high flights at seven o'clock. These E/A were painted slate grey and blue on top of fuselage. One of our A/C was damaged (noted above) from all these attacks, no others suffered any damage whatsoever. (See Flak Report for Flak).

10. Bombing Data:

a. Observations:

The lead and low squadron's bombfall appeared to fall somewhat short and to the right of the MPI - some clusters of I'Bs hit corner of MPI building. The high squadron's bombs hit a bit to the right but covered the MPI.

b. Disposition of Bombs:

Lead Squadron:

Of the 12 A/C sorties, eleven attacked the target, dropping 8 X 1000# RDX, 36 X 1000# GP and 33 X 500# IB bombs. A/C 132 returned early with 4 X 1000# GP's and 5 X 1000# IB's

Low Squadron:

All 12 A/C scheduled attacked the target, dropping 16 X 1000# RDX, 32 X 1000# GP and 36 X 500# IB bombs.

High Squadron:

Of the 11 A/C sorties, nine attacked the target, dropping 36 X 1000# GP and 27 X 500# IB. A/C 44-6113 damaged from E/A attacks jettisoned, presumably, 4 GP's and 3 IB's as it turned back before the target. A/C 664 returned early with 4 GP's and 3 IB's.

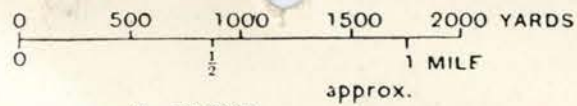

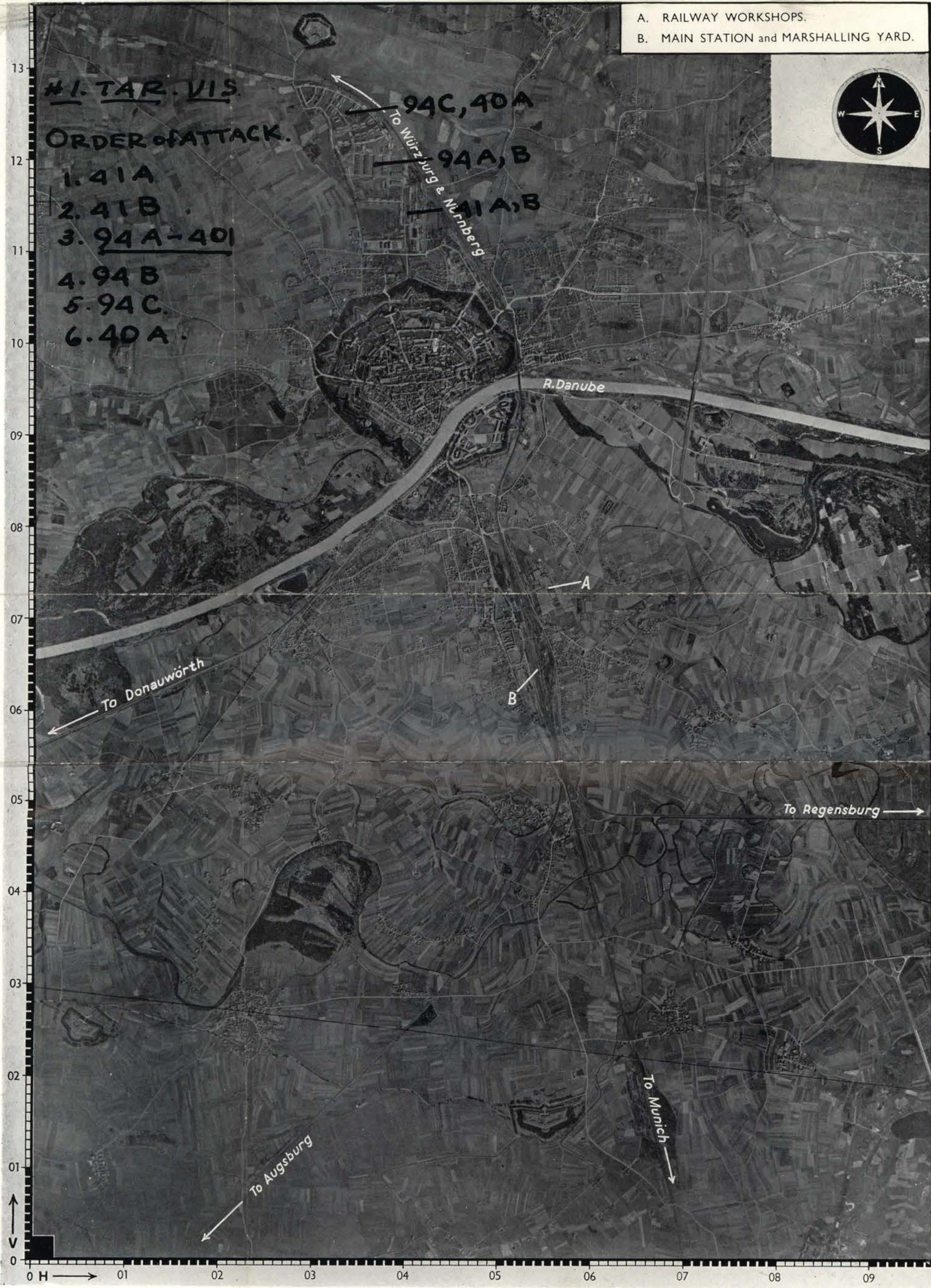
